Unique approaches to program design and leadership enliven and strengthen Seeds of Solidarity. Our Women Healing Women Healing Earth program thrives! An awesome team of culturally diverse educators provide fabulous

and free arts, nature, cooking, and healing workshops from spring through fall, where local women counter isolation and stress with creativity and connection. We are excited to plan the 2024 series!



Grow the Future was the theme for our workshops for all ages. Some participants came to re-establish chestnuts for food and habitat. Others spent a constructive weekend together in a DIY

building intensive. Farmers and gardeners flocked to our annual no-till agriculture workshop for healthy soil and climate resilience, that we offered free of charge to farmers of color and those impacted by devastating flooding this year.

Our classes at our county jail combine hands-on gardening with discussion of health, environmental, and social justice topics, and provide college credit to people incarcerated. Strong interest among





participants to continue to engage in honest and thought-provoking dialogue gave rise to a new bi-weekly Authentic Conversation class at the jail led by Seeds of Solidarity co-founder Ricky. (over)

Our Stocking Up Farmshare program in collaboration with Quabbin Harvest coop provides a monthly bag of quality food, recipes, and family activities to local families struggling to make ends meet. In addition, brimming boxes of our produce go to SNAP beneficiaries through Quabbin Harvest, and our own farmstand serves hundreds of community members through fresh, low-cost produce. We enjoy serving as a learning site for a local community college's sustainable agriculture class, and are pleased to bring our Grow Food Everywhere workshops off-site too,

including as faculty at the Omega Institute for Holistic Studies. Participating in the International Wellbeing Summit held there this fall fueled our plans to develop team building and leadership retreats at Seeds of Solidarity in the year to come.



This year marked the 25th North Quabbin Garlic and Arts Festival. Seeds of Solidarity is among the co-founders and organizers of this event that uplifts farm and art livelihoods and revitalizes our region. New Seeds of Solidarity contributions this year included an Honoring our Waters installation, poetry readings on the spoken word stage by women in our programs, and a free garlic recipes booklet.
